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# Tutto Italiano Benvenuto a *Tutto Italiano*

One hundred years ago, on January 20th, <u>Federico Fellini</u> was born in Rimini (region of Emilia-Romagna). He showed an early interest in drawing and movies, and was inspired by the work of Charlie Chaplin, Buster Keaton, Laurel and Hardy, the Marx brothers, and Roberto Rossellini.

In high school, he was hired by the manager of the local cinema to draw caricatures of the movie stars appearing in the films being shown; with the posters used to promote the movies. He also provided comic strips for several publications. In 1939, Fellini moved to Rome and joined the editorial staff of *Marc'Aurelio*, a popular satirical magazine, staying until 1942. During that time, he also wrote monologues for radio hosts and for Aldo Fabrizi, a well-known comedian, actor, director, and screenwriter.

Through his scriptwriting, Fellini worked with Rossellini and met Giulietta Masina, an actress he married in 1943. Fellini co-directed his first film in 1950 and his first as sole director was in 1952. In 1954, Masina starred in Fellini's film *La Strada* with Anthony Quinn. The film won numerous awards, including the Academy Award for Best Foreign Language Film; one of four Fellini received (in the Best Foreign Language Film category); the most of any director.

Throughout his career, "Fellini frequently drew the characters of his movies. [He] believed in developing a character by drawing that character, a key part of his creative process." Fellini is known for his unconventional style of filmmaking, described as Felliniesque, "where dreams and reality are perceived as one experience."

This year, <u>numerous celebrations were planned</u>, including a collaboration between the <u>British Film Institute and Luce Cinecittà</u> (subsidized by the Italian Ministry for Culture); but because of the virus, many had been cancelled and some have been postponed. However, numerous educational presentations are still being conducted and a variety of websites offers different perspectives on the director and his work.

#### **Venice in the News**

Since then, JoAnn has introduced me to several residents of Venice who have provided their insights into the dilemmas the city faces.
