Tutto Italiano Benvenuto a *Tutto Italiano*

Italy is a land of festivals. Throughout the world it's known for <u>Carnevale</u>, <u>the Biennale</u>, and the <u>International Film Festival</u>, all held in Venice. Some nationwide events include <u>Epiphany</u> (January 6th), <u>Pasquetta</u> (April), <u>Festa della Repubblica</u> (June 2nd), <u>Ferragosto</u> (August 15th), and the Allhallowtide Triduum of <u>All Hallow's Eve</u>, <u>All Saint's Day</u>, and <u>All Soul's Day</u>, celebrated from October 31st to November 2nd.

Popular regional celebrations are the <u>Procession of the Mysteries</u> in Trapani, Sicily (Good Friday); <u>Rome's Birthday</u> (April 21st); Sardegna's <u>La Cavalcata Sarda</u> (May); <u>Festa dei Ceri</u> in Gubbio, Umbria (May); <u>Festival of San Ranieri</u> in Pisa (June 16th); <u>Palio di Siena</u> (July 2nd and August 16th); and <u>Eurochocolate</u> in Perugia, Umbria (October).

Within each region, the villages also celebrate – usually in tribute to their patron saint – with parades, dances, musical performances, games, food, and wine. As Italian immigrants settled in America, they retained their ancestral village bonds and formed Italian American neighborhoods. Their similarities kept them connected and in going through the rough times of assimilation, the festivals of the old country brought comfort through familiarity.

For at least the past ten years, the <u>Order Sons and Daughters of Italy in America</u> has published an annual list of Italian American festivals held each year. From its <u>publication last year:</u> "This directory lists over 200 Italian festivals held in states around the country. The directory supplies each festival's name, month, city, state and website." (The past few years have curtailed many outdoor festivities.) Although held all year, August and September are the most popular months for Italian American festivals. By far, New York has more festivals than any other state. The <u>Feast of San Gennaro</u> in New York City is an eleven-day event: this year from September 15th to September 25th. The festival has a live broadcast and major attractions include Blessing of the Stands, Grand Procession, High Mass, live entertainment, and food competitions.

New Jersey, Ohio, and Pennsylvania follow New York; with California, Illinois, and Massachusetts close behind in the number of annual Italian American festivals. Some of the most popular festivals, though, occur in other states: the West Virginia Italian Heritage Festival, "Celebrating culture and tradition since 1979," was held over Labor Day weekend; the Tontitown Grape Festival in Arkansas has paid tribute to its founder, Father Pietro Bandini, for 123 years each August; and the San Gennaro Feast in Henderson, Nevada (on the outskirts of Las Vegas) celebrates its 42nd year with a five-day event later this month. Also later this month, the one-day Festa Italiana in Raleigh, North Carolina moves into its fourth year of celebrating Italian culture and heritage.

Original holder of the patent for the forerunner of today's telephone.

## Italian American Heritage Project

Keep your Italian heritage alive. An excellent source for learning about Italian American culture and heritage is a museum specifically established to focus on the Italian American experience. Many have virtual exhibits and tours available on their websites. List of Italian American Museums.
